1. Report on “Adult Education Programme”

The National Literacy Mission (NLM), launched in 1988, is the program undertaken by the Government for adult education. To bolster ‘Adult Education and Skill Development’, the Government so introduced two new schemes, namely Saakshar Bharat and Scheme for Support to Voluntary Agencies for Adult Education and Skill Development, during the 11th Plan. Saakshar Bharat is the world's largest adult education programme, which envisages making 70 million adults literate by 2017.



“The goal of NLM is to attain full literacy (with the sustainable threshold level of 75 per cent). NLM envisages that focussing on **imparting of functional literacy** to non-literates in the **15-35 age group** would help achieve this goal. This age group has been selected because they are in the productive as well as the reproductive period of life.

In the connection our NSS Units organize a Programme of Adult Education simultaneously at Baganpara and Majh pukurpar adopted villages on 18.7.2018 and 23.9.2018. At the programme, our NSS Volunteers (59), college staffs teach the adult people to develop their skill. There were also present two Programme Officers, Nilotpal Ghosh and Animesh Pal in the programme and they also teach them.

2. Report on “Tree Plantation”

Every man needs the oxygen for their life and Trees are the foremost source of oxygen as well trees help to reduce the level of carbon dioxide.

As we all know that the whole world is facing the problem of global warming and to recover from such problem planting the trees has become one of the most important today's aspects.

The NSS Units of Gushkara Mahavidyalaya organized “**Tree Plantation**” programme under the National Service Scheme (NSS) on 12.8.2018 at the college campus. There were present college staffs, NSS Programme Officers and 27 student volunteers.



Under the Guidance of Prof. Nilotpal Ghosh, and Prof. Animesh Pal NSS Programme Officers, NSS volunteers (27) planted more than 25 trees. The students also placed bricks as barricades and each student took the responsibility to nourish and maintain the allocated plant.

3. Report on Thalassemia Awareness & Precaution Activity

Thalassemia is the most common congenital single-gene condition. It is marked by a lack of or reduced synthesis of either the alpha-or beta-globins chains and passed down from parents to off spring. This study aimed to determine how healthy students in Indian universities were aware of thalassemia and how they felt about it.



In the regard, our NSS team organizes a awareness programme on 26.8.2018 at Baganpara with 59 NSS Volunteers, two Programme Officers Prof. Nilotpal Ghosh and Prof. Animesh Pal of the two units and two non-teaching staffs Mr. Dipankar Mondal and Mr. Hemanta Mukherjee, Gushkara Mahavidyalaya, Purba Bardhaman .

Dr. D.T. Dutta, Medical Officer of Guskara Primary Health Centre delivered the causes, effects of the Thalassemia and also the measures taken by the people to control Thalassemia. Dr. Pan, our Principal also delivered the effects of Thalassemia.

4. Report on Dengue Awareness & Precaution Activity

Dengue fever has become a threat to the country especially during the rainy seasons. In order to facilitate the curbing of this disease, 51 NSS Volunteers, two Programme Officers Prof. Nilotpal Ghosh and Prof. Animesh Pal of the two units and two non-teaching staffs Mr. Dipankar Mondal and Mr. Hemanta Mukherjee, Gushkara Mahavidyalaya, Purba Bardhaman were involved in a dengue prevention activity at Baganpara and Majhpukurpar on 27.7.18 and 11.9.18. The Volunteers were divided into two groups and were allotted a specific location at Baganpara and Majhpukurpar adopted village, near our college.

The students were instructed to identify places within the village where *Aedes* mosquitoes were likely to breed. They were provided with disposable gloves, masks and disinfectant. The students screened the campus for stagnant water and tried to eliminate them. They emptied and removed empty cartons and containers filled with water. They also sprinkled disinfectants on the ground and places where complete removal of cartons was not possible. They made sure that the disinfectants (bleaching powder) were not sprinkled in regions where fish and other aquatic animals would be affected. The students gathered together after completing their tasks and shared their experiences. They also practiced for a skit programme to be performed for the college community to create awareness on prevention of dengue. 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
14. Report on International World Forest Day


15. Report on Save The Girl Child
