1. Course Duration of: 42 effective days.

3. Director or his/her nominee will act as the Centre-in-Charge for a particular venue of examination.
4. The Certificate Course being a practical oriented programme, a student must attend at least 60% of the total number of classes held. In case a student fails to attend the requisite number of classes but has attended 50% of total classes he/she would be allowed to appear in the examination as per discretion of Director, Lifelong Learning. The students who have attended less than 50% of total classes will not be allowed to appear for the examination in the respective year.
5. To qualify
 - i. A candidate must secure at least 30% marks in Theoretical papers;
 - ii. In Practical / Project Work/ Practice Teaching including viva a candidate must secure 50% marks;

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- iii. The candidate must secure 40% marks in aggregate;
6. In computation of result Grade system will be followed as noted below.
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| i. | 40% & above but below 50% marks in aggregate = | B |
| ii. | 50% & above but below 60% marks in aggregate = | B+ |
| iii. | 60% & above but below 70% marks in aggregate = | A |
| iv. | 70% & above in aggregate = | A+ |
| v. | Below 40% in aggregate = | NQ [Not Qualified] |
7. The candidates must have to appear the entire examination irrespective of Theoretical or Practical portion/ paper(s).
8. If a candidate fails to appear all / any particular paper(s) (Theoretical or Practical portion as the case may be) he / she must have to appear in the examination of the relevant paper(s) in the next programme.
9. In case, a candidate fails to secure Qualifying marks more than one papers (irrespective of theoretical or practical portion as the case may be) he/she must have to appear in the examination of the relevant paper(s) in the next examination retaining the credit of other paper(s) (irrespective of nature of the paper i.e. theoretical or practical).
10. If a candidate fails to secure Qualifying marks in only one paper, either Theoretical or Practical portion but secures 40% marks in aggregate of Theoretical & Practical portion he / she will be allowed to appear in the examination in the relevant papers in the next programme.
11. A candidate will get two consecutive chances to pass the examination within two consecutive years to be calculated from the year of original enrolment.
12. Candidates securing qualifying marks in Theoretical and Practical portion as the case may be will not be allowed to reappear in the relevant portion for the examination further.
13. There is no scope of Post Publication Review/ Scrutiny for any paper(s) irrespective of nature of the paper (Theoretical and /or Practical).
